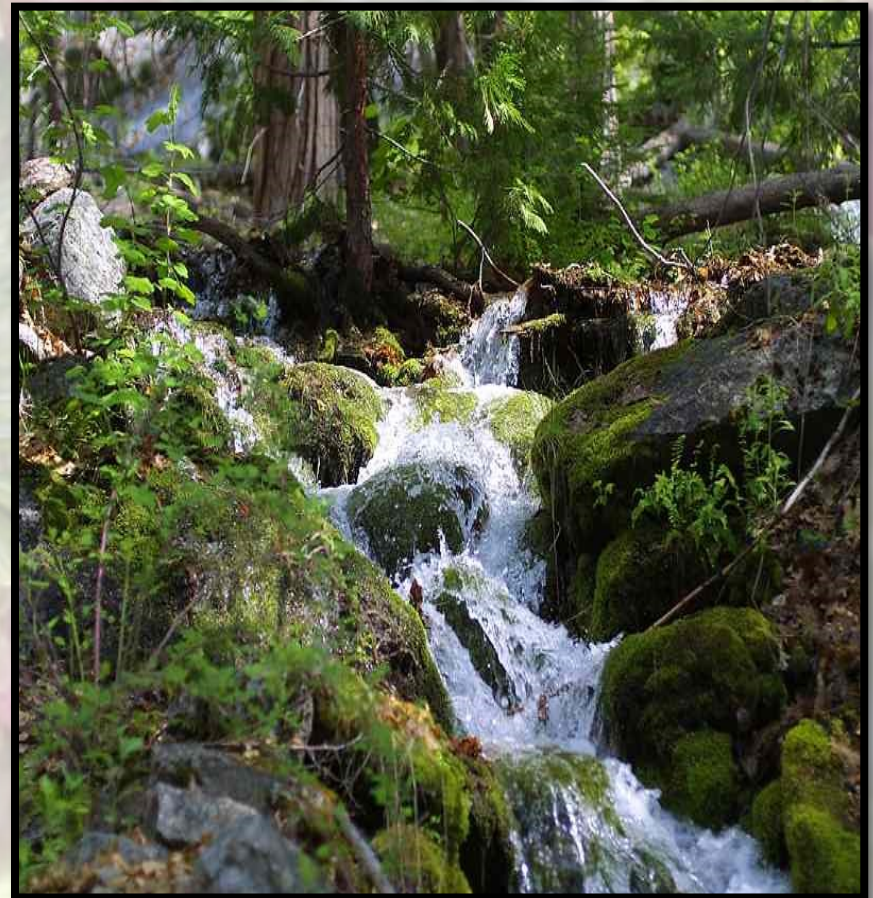

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Attendees will:

- 1) Become familiar with SEER Educate by doing sample cases on Bladder. Emphasis will be given on Bladder MPH Rules and grade.
- 2) Review AJCC staging principals with a focus on use of blanks vs. X's, when clinical data items can be used for pathologic staging and when pathologic data items can be used for clinical staging.
- 3) Be able to understand AJCC 8th edition Chapter 1 key rules with their rationale. Identify changes between 7th and 8th editions based on data showing inconsistency or inaccuracy.
- 4) Learn about literature related to cancer inquiries, learn about some of the issues with working with cancer data, and know about OSCaR's new approach in assessing and responding to cancer inquiries.
- 5) Gain an understanding of the current standard of care on radiation therapy options for early-stage and locally-advanced non-small cell lung cancer. And to understand the current role of radiation therapy for small cell lung cancer.
- 6) Gain insight into the process of evaluating a new breast cancer patient. Learn how clinicians guesstimate stage. And how clinical stage affects treatment recommendations.
- 7) Understand the philosophy of palliative care. Know the difference between primary, secondary and tertiary palliative care. And learn how primary care and specialty providers (including oncology) can incorporate palliative care principles into their practices.
- 8) Learn about obstacles and challenges that were found in implementing a survivorship program that attempted to meet the Commission on Cancer Standard 3.3 for survivorship care at a busy community cancer center.
