As I am sitting at this year's fall workshop, it is both exciting and sad. I am retiring this month.

I look around the room and realize what an incredible career I've had. And also realize that I am the only one in the room to have taken the first CTR exam in 1983. So many of my peers, friends, have either, retired or passed away. What a group of us back then. We all took our exam in Portland and then collapsed at the local bar to compare answers and we were all sure none of passed the exam. The waiting was horrible, but I am happy to say we all made it. At that time no one knew what the exam would entail. There were no study modules to use. OTRA (Oregon Tumor Registrar Association) developed our own study modules and we studied in groups. One of the sections I did the worst on was computerization. Back then, we did not have computers. All of our abstracts were done on paper and sent to a Central Registry for them to input our data. I didn't have a clue what the difference between hardware and software was. Look were we are 30 yrs later.

Our "Threads" were each other and the phone. My registry was 2 years behind when I took it over and I will never forget my mentors, Marilyn Desler, Diana Mahin, Karen Brown, Alice Pernitti and Bernitta Woods. Dr. Ted Willilamson was Salem Hospital's advisor for the registry. He would not budge on our reference date, so it was struggle to get follow-up caught up. We worked with tickler cards for follow-up. To this day Salem Hospital still has a reference date of 1960. Later on we were introduced to the Oregon Comprehensive Data Management team (OCDP) all of our abstracts were submitted on paper to them and they did a 100% QA on every case. This was the beginning of data consistency between hospitals. And a wonderful leaning tool for all.

My career has allowed me to use my expertise in many ways. I worked for Salem Hospital for 13 years as the registry supervisor. I was then blessed and privileged to take a job with Onco Inc. I was there for 12 years. I was a support/trainer for their software OncoLog. I was able to travel the United States, meeting registrar's and connecting with them. It was an opportunity I cherish to this day.

It has been a pleasure to be part of great organization such at OCRA. I served in just about every office there was. I cannot express my thanks to all members that run for office. I hope everyone will continue to support OCRA by running for office and mentoring the new registrar's coming along. Enjoy the ride of changes always taking place. I refer to it as my "Lumosity", keeping my mind active

I look forward to spending more time with grandkids, and two spoiled cats, my craft room, my beading, traveling, bible study and sleeping in. I am keeping my CTR for awhile, just in case I get bored and want to get back in the game (part time). So who knows? I may see you at another workshop in the future.
