Thank you so much for participating in this year's annual basket raffle program. We had another banner year in raffle ticket sales. An article will be published in the next issue of *The Connection* highlighting the basket raffle program and the winners of the state baskets.


Note: If your State Association participated in the Group Discount program in 2021, the rebate check will be sent mid to late July.

A Couple of Text Tips

A little tip I'd like to share for all those typing text into an abstract with a Microsoft Word Document. Type in your text and then copy and paste it into an abstract, then highlight it and just above in the home tab for "Font" there is an "A "with an eraser just slightly underneath it. Click on this "A" with the eraser and it will erase all the

hidden extras and copy just the text over to the abstract. This simple tip will help clean the data before the abstracts are transmitted to the state, NCDB, and etc.


Another handy tip (which I never knew before) is the Aa button in the same home tab just to the left of the A that is underlined in a color (mine is underlined in red) there is a dropdown arrow that you can choose an uppercase or lowercase text, I like to use the lowercase to type an email and forget to change it back to cap lock again, and without deleting my text I use this handy little tip to fix my text. 
Multicentric vs Multifocal

Multifocal disease is when there are two (or more) masses within the same quadrant, or at the borders of that quadrant (12, 3, 6, 9). For example, a mass at 12:00 and a mass at 2:00 would be Multifocal disease. Multicentric disease is when there are two masses (or

more) in different quadrants. For example, a mass at 12:00 and a mass at 5:00.

I have never heard or read an explanation that made sense, but for some reason today it did! I just thought I would share with all of you! By Nicole Davis, CTR






IACR 10.12-14.2021
